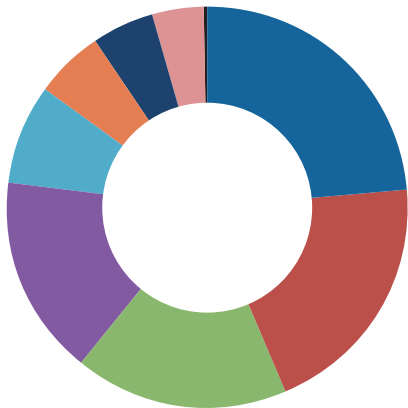


# WHAT DID YOUR TAX DOLLARS PAY FOR IN FISCAL YEAR 2023?

## FISCAL YEAR 2023 FAST FACTS

The State began the fiscal year with a General Funds accounts payable of \$1.5 billion. The accounts payable ended the fiscal year at \$484 million, a 67% decline in pending bills since the start of the fiscal year and the lowest accounts payable to end a fiscal year since 2008.

Illinois' Rainy Day Fund began the fiscal year with a balance of \$752 million and ended with a balance of \$1.940 billion, the highest amount to end a fiscal year since the fund was created in 2001. The Rainy Day Fund balance continues to set new records every month.

Illinois collected \$53.1 billion in General Funds base revenues during fiscal year 2023, an increase of more than \$2 billion, or 4.0%, compared to fiscal year 2022.
